And on what was earlier a pitchers mound, a fire pit. And a **Lars Mogensen** landscaped entrance. Sunday work-bees continue and everyone is welcome, contact **Andrea Butler**.

**15 Bamfielders** met at **Lars Mogensen's** place, June 7, to consider growth of West Park. **Pat Byres** noted the Park's value to Lady Rose visitors: an easily accessible, scenic picnic spot. **Rose Janelle** said the Hall Society considered the park an asset to Hall functions. Everyone agreed a grounds maintenance program is needed. Picnic tables, a Gazebo, and the community garden could be first steps. **John Mass** pointed out money is not an issue, it is skilled, consistent volunteers (he then donated \$100 from Broken Island Adventures). He also noted that the west side had received about \$1800 per year for maintaining out-houses. **Brunhilde Niederacher** called attention to a second park on the west side that features a trail.

**Linda Myres** noted all Bamfield parks should be considered together. A meeting will be called to establish a

**Bamfield's 1<sup>st</sup> Boil Water Advisory.** For 8 days, earlier this month, Bamfielders were requested to boil drinking water. According to **Andy Daniel**, ACRD Manager, Environmental Services, this was done as a precaution as some de-chlorinated water had entered our system...no contamination was found. Vancouver Island Health Authority reviewed the shut down and was pleased with the way it was handled and with our water quality [see VIHA letter, [www.bamfielder.ca](http://www.bamfielder.ca)]. We have a difficult system to control: our lines are like a Christmas tree with no looping. A looped system keeps water moving and is easier to keep clean. Andy appreciates the team effort of our operator, **Les Butler**, and the Water Board (**B. Anholt, P. Byres, E. Geall, L. Myres, M. Salmon**). He hopes we will conserve and appreciate our water resource. L. Druehl

Fishing along the Wall, Kirby Point, Edward King or over to Austin Island should continue to be good right through the next few weeks. Try using small spoons, 48 inches behind a flasher for Chinook and Coho. On the off-shore banks lots of Coho and Chinook as well as Halibut are waiting for your hook. **Park Confusion.** Some residents think they should have free launching and moorage because it's their taxes that pay for the park. Centennial Park receives 6000-tax dollars per year, which is 12% of the park's budget. The remainder comes from park/marina users. The tax money covers west-side out-house maintenance (\$1740 + toilet paper & chips), marina insurance (\$1200), Hydro, water, & garbage (\$2700). The remaining monies go to salaries, park maintenance and improvements and a nest egg for eventual dock and float replacements. Eileen Scott
