Head Chief, **Derek Peters** noted, "We have many citizens who remember growing up in what is now Bamfield Inlet, so to gain some of it back is a step in the right direction." *L. 
A lively Affairs. 27 villagers attended the January Community Affairs meeting. **Bill Collette**, Port Alberni Chamber, introduced Port's contribution to Canada's 150th year (2017): three races will be conducted: July 1 swimming around the *Mars Bomber* on Sprout Lake, July 2 bicycling racing the *Francis Barkley* to Bamfield, and July 3 foot racing the steam train to McLean's Mill. **Kristin Russell** noted the school Christmas Concert was a success (everyone present agreed) and that \$980 was raised for field trips. **Sean Rogers** made his debut as Acting Director of the marine station, exclaiming this is a busy time and villagers are welcome. **Keith Wyton**, Reg. Dir., noted the Federal Government persists in wanting to get out of running the West Dock. This is being challenged as there is no option. A private report suggests it is not economically feasible to log the Deer Group. Perhaps our Community Forest could oversee these lands. A request to review alternative treatments of our water is being put forward. **Ken Hawkins** outlined his plans to provide bus and freight service to Port. **Amilia Vos** is spear heading a program to train first responders. *L. A Tribute to a Great Bamfielder. Pat Garcia was born **Patricia Smith** on April 7, 1935 in East Coker, Somersetshire, England: she passed away at the West Coast General Hospital on Dec. 3, 2015 after a brief illness. Predeceased by her parents and husband Joe. She is survived by her brothers, **Ron, Gerald** and **Tom**, her children, **Ian (Monica)** and **Debra (Dan)** as well as four grandchildren, **Nikki (Cole), Joey (Whitney), Callie** and **Brianna**. Pat emigrated to Canada in 1958. In Vancouver she saw an advertisement for a Red Cross "Outpost Nurse" position for which she successfully applied, arriving in Bamfield in February 1960 aboard the MV Uchuck. There she met her fisherman husband, Joe: they were married on Nov 6, 1961 in the Bamfield United Church. As a team, Pat and **Joe Garcia** contributed mightily to the well being and development of the community they loved. In addition to 37 years of nursing service at the Bamfield Outpost Hospital Pat was elected to several terms as Regional Director and sometimes Chairman of the Alberni Clayoquot Regional Board. Her 2007 book, "Bamfield - Looking Back" provides a remarkable first hand record, as she writes, "of a true community of people helping themselves to make a great community". The many contributions of Pat and Joe to this enterprise were formidable. Her volunteer work was recognized in 2001, during the UN's International Year of the Volunteer, with a citation from the Government of Canada. On a personal note we will miss a loyal friend, someone who held strong opinions and an even stronger sense of fairness and the proper way of doing things. Her sense of neighbourliness was loving, generous and open minded. As a nurse she was exceptionally talented, a master diagnostician who overcame seasickness to ensure she reached those in need. She stands tall among those many newcomers to a small and isolated fishing port on Canada's West coast seeking a better life, but also willing and able to contribute to making life better for those around her, her family, friends and neighbours. *John & Bev McInerney*
