Let's do it! \$8250 of the required \$20,000 was raised on Canada Day for a new park pavilion. Eileen's 1984 Ford raffled off for \$1345. A, resident of Helby, purchased the last ticket and won! The new pavilion, dedicated to Bamfield Volunteerism, will provide covered space for public and private functions such as family picnics, seating for concerts, pig roasts and chili cook-offs. <u>Moorage issues.</u> The Bamfield Harbour Authority's AGM was attended by the Directors: **Wendy Lukas**, **Keith Wyton**, **Rick Sweeting**, **Barry Sills** and **Rae Hopkins**, the Wharfinger, **Amy McConnell**, and two folks from the general public: **Brian Douillard** and **Louis Druehl** (both being spouses of a director). One director's position was up for election: Lukas, and she was returned to the Authority. The major issue facing BHA is providing access to Bamfielders wishing to make short westside visits. The floats must be self sustaining, and this can only be accomplished by renting space. The Authority will explore ways to remedy this situation. Public input is welcomed. *L. Druehl*

<u>Bamfield Aired</u>. **Megan Thomas**, CBC, who whirl-winded through Bamfield, produced a snap shot. **Trevor Cootes** spoke of a tourist-industry generated future, focused on First Nations history and culture. He sees a doubling or more of the present 100 HFN residents by welcoming about half of the 300 away-from-home folks by 2023. Fleeting mention of LNG was made. **Keith Wyton** described the Bamfield Road as being a filter, but as tourism grows, "Natural evolution will bring improvements to the road." *What Louis heard on Victoria CBC radio.*

A family connection. Henry Garrard worked at the Cable Station as a telegrapher and his grandson, Greg Garrard, is presently teaching at the Marine Station. Between these events Greg's father was Bamfield raised in the 1940s and 50s. Greg is coteaching "In pursuit of the Whale: whaling literature and whales in literature." Barkley Sound with its Huuay-aht First Nations 5000 years of whaling tradition, fairly recent whale rendering and now whale watching is an ideal setting for this exploration. For his 12 students, its an opportunity to co-exist with students of marine sciences and to experience the real thing... whales in the sea. When asked if he had seen any station ghosts, he said no. But walking on the boardwalk, he had the feeling, "It's nice to be back...in terms of family." Greg is a relative of Donna Dunn through marriage: "His great-grandfather was brother to my first cousin's grandfather." Small World. L. Druehl
