**Summer/Fall weather**. July and August were dry: 14mm (.55") and 9mm (.35") of rain; September was wet, 298mm (11.7"); 137mm (5.4") is average. But October was beautiful—remember? with only 145mm (5.7") rain. November 26 regis-

tered 109mm (4.3") of rain. With 3 days left in November, we have 502mm (19.8") rain (average, 372mm (14.6")). It gets wetter: last November 734mm (28.9") rain. Brady Beach had 32 tents on May Long weekend and 22 tents over Canada Day. Mostly it was tourist impact this summer as the fog and overcast kept the Bamfielders at bay. Howev-

er, there were some hardcore Bamfielders that usually made a visit fog or not, and that would be a couple of gals from Pacific
