## Premier outlines a path for Bamfield Road. November 14, 2019 – Premier John Horgan lived up to a promise made in



NURSE SAVES PATIENT'S LIFE AS BOAT UPSETS. A Red Cross nurse transporting an expectant mother by boat from Bamfield, V.I. to Port Alberni saved her patient's life when the boat got into difficulty, it was revealed today by a delegate to the BC Red Cross convention in Hotel Vancouver. Miss Heather M. Moore, secretary of the tiny Red Cross Branch of 182 members at Bamfield, reported this as one of the outstanding instances of what outpost nurses have to contend with. The nurse, Miss E. Knowlton, Red Cross attendant at the small hospital at Bamfield was called to look after the woman and started with her to Port Alberni. The two women were making their way along the Alberni Canal when the boat got upset and had to be abandoned. The nurse was able to reach a raft which she manoeuvred into position for the patient and both women remained on the raft until another boat coming through the canal picked them up. Out in the cold. Thirteen Community Affairs attendees retreated from the locked school to the Fire Hall, where they learned that the BCAS directors had agreed to limit grants-in-aid to \$5000. A motion was passed that grants greater than \$5K would require a popular vote to go forward. Bob Beckett, Reg. Dir. noted the ACRD had recognized Linda and Larry Myre's contributions. He described meetings related to the road, emphasising an emotional stop by Premier John Horgan and company at the bus crash site (see photo front page), declaring, "...the deaths of the two students, John Geerdes and Emma Machado, will not be in vain." There will be an ACRD Zoning Bylaw review (see planning@acrd.bc.ca). Funding to complete the parking project may be available from Gas tax and UBCM grants. Stefan Ochman noted the HFN/Bamfield Community Forest will be putting in a 1 km meridian trail for public access. Donna Dunn noted we now have a computerized heart monitor; all but two students have received flu shots, and a Health Care Aide has been hired by VIHA for Bamfield.
