Roger joined the Bamfield Volunteer Fire Department in '71, Wally Sommerville was fire chief. Roger was the only one with firefighting experience. "When we started, we didn't have a pump or hoses. We couldn't practice." Finally, they got a boat, the Darlene Sommerville, and a pump. Roger &










Same beach, a few days earlier...
