A Big Step Forward. The plant being constructed is a Moving Bed Biological Reactor wastewater treatment plant; a newer sewage treatment process that uses a screen plant, high surface area media in a series of aerobic reactor tanks, solid separation and UV disinfection. Solids will be trucked to Port Alberni for disposal. The plant

is equipped with an odor abatement system. The resulting effluent is extremely clean. The plant will service between 400 to 1100 people. The drawing, below, illustrates the approximate layout for the new Hall at the corner of Nuthatch and Pachena Roads. The basic building, as designed by Wayne Wenstob, features a large banquet/ performance/indoor recreation hall, some office and meeting space and a commercial kitchen. Interest has been expressed to accommodate museum displays, crafts, senior lounging and children activities, and other. Soon, COVID-19 willing, invite your input on the new Hall components.
