First Nation Culture Warrior Brothers, Tim Massa and Hjalmar Wenstob advance Nuu-chah-nulth culture through song, dance, and art. Tim, impressed with his brother's response to traditional healing, decided to advance culture. In grade 6, disheartened with lack of First Nation language



instruction, he started to promote language instruction. This cascaded nationally and then internationally. In grade 8 he was teaching language. Joining his brother, they created a COVID healing song for everyone to share. Hjalmar carved a COVID

transformation mask (moveable hands covering the face when opened revealed red dots leaving the mouth)\_in the tradition of historical masks that spoke of small pox, the first encounter and such. "As a modern treaty nation, Huu-ay-aht will decide how best to manage our lands and resources," Tayii Hawilth (Hereditary Chief) **Derek Peters**. The HFN forests are 33% old growth (older than 250 years). The BC government has asked for a 2-year deferral on old growth harvest. The HFN will defer logging 96% of their old growth for 2 years. They plan to harvest the remaining 4% to protect their economic development. The HFN plans to make its final decisions on deferrals mid-January 2022. Persistent bear problems in Bamfield. Several homes throughout Bamfield have had their deep freezers raided, sometimes, more than once.
