

Affairs AGM. Three directors stepped away from the Board: Doug Greer, Jared Higgins and John Mass. Three directors were willing to stand for re-election: Susan Derasp (Treasurer), Julie Bradley and Jan Teversham (Secretary). Four directors stayed on the Board: Jamie Willock (Chair), Jaleen Rousseau (Vice Chair), Stella Wenstob and Glenn Ballman. Three new candidates are now on the Board: Tom Jensen, Bob Schmitt and Ben West. Three active Grants-in-Aid were approved: West Park Pavilion (\$1843, J. Tevershan), Bear Aware (\$3000, Mandy Ross), Bamfield Active Transport (\$6650, J. Willock). L. Druehl, abstracted from unofficial minutes.

May Affairs zoomed by a whooping 42 folks, was highlighted by Sean Rogers, BMSC, announcing marine station land is available to meet the need of community members who want to own homes and cannot afford to buy them at current prices, and Music-by-the-Sea will be held at the station 26 July; Robin Schmitt noting a third teacher will be hired, providing Bamfield/Anacla K-12 capability, Robert Dennis, HFN, advised of a forthcoming discussion on Huu-ay-aht local place names, Kevin Gordon, Bamfield Main, stated the new plan is to totally gravel the entire road, to be surfaced later, Julie Bradley, Bamfield Arts Council, declared there will be Art In The Eileen Scott Centennial Park, 10 July, Bob Beckett. ACRD: reviewing ferry service, preparing OCP for community review, and working on strategies to prepare Bamfield for future growth pains, JP Hastey, Community Hall, new hall site being prepared for construction with Wayne Wenstob directing the on-ground orientation. Clay Steel discussed E-Charging Stations for Bamfield. The Bamfield Community Hall has expressed interest in this project The motion was passed that Affairs contact ACRD for granting opportunities. \$500 will be advanced to Music-by-the-Sea. L. Druehl from unofficial minutes.

Editor's Observation. Community Affairs started as the voice and ears of Bamfield, communicating with the ACRD through our Regional Director. The ACRD decided on Grants-in-Aid. Later the GIA monies were passed to our Affairs and grants were decided by meeting attendees. Now the Affairs Board members decide on the grants (see AGM notes above). Presently, the Affairs Board acts as a town council, which I think is a good thing. Judging by the remarks of the new board members, I have a feeling the board is taking on the flavour of a corporate board. Let's see in what direction they take/lead us. L. Druehl

Last year we had a lot of conflict with bears getting into unmanaged attractants; garbage, chicken coops, compost, outdoor freezers and fish refuse in the intertidal. Bears have excellent memories and if they received a food reward last year from any of the above they will be back for more this year! So, please make sure you secure your attractants! Secure bins, use electric fencing around chicken coops, put fish refuse in deep water and keep your freezers secured indoors.
