**<u>QEII and Bamfield</u>**. Recently, the Queen congratulated our **Eileen Scott** on her 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday. Earlier, on 31 October 2002, Canada Post launched a stamp in Bamfield commemorating the 31 October 1902 opening of the Bamfield



Cable Station. This opening signaled the completion of The All Red Route (a cable system that connected the countries of the British Empire), the brain child of **Sanford Fleming** (honored by two islands in the Deer Group). During the Bamfield postage stamp launch, a telegrapher sent a computer assisted telegraph (Morse Code) message of greetings to **QEII** that traveled half around the world to the Queen, who responded, "Good show, Bamfield" in a message that completed circling the globe. *L*.

## Keep our bears alive. Bears are getting ready for hibernation.

There has been a lot of conflict with bears already and it will get worse as they approach hibernation. We have already had bears break into vehicles, sheds, trailers, basements and outdoor freezers. Some bears have figured out how to open car doors, so lock your door and keep windows up. Freeze smelly food waste until garbage day and take garbage out frequently. If you are using a public garbage bin, make sure the bear-bar is in the upright position and secured with a carabiner.
