ing (A given!) and piano (Okay!). When asked, what are some of your present activities as



coordinator, she replied, two after school clubs, hustling for books, Friday Nights for older kids, and Little Buddies Playtime (Exploring the Forest, see upper photo).

Likes about Bamfield: Helpful & Friendly..."Showing up with casserole and their fridge is full." And long term Bamfield plans depends on long term housing. *L. Druehl*

An incomplete Community Affairs reporting (minutes not available). 35 zoomed. ACRD discussed new/revised Development Cost Change bylaws. Julie Bradley noted budget issue with water system: The water pipe servicing Grappler is too small to allow for addition. A developer wishing to hook up would have to pay for waterline upgrade = \$500K. Bamfield Lodge presented its case to increase its moorage in terms of its business and general westside moorage issues. In essence they are stymied by virtue that they are on a government lease (see Westside moorage below) The Bamfield Community Hall Society noted it is in discussion with Bob Schmitt, (Bamford Community Emergency Program) on the possibility of housing emergency gear in the new Hall; also, the Hall noted it would be accommodating the Bamfield historical archives. L. Druehl, based on vague zoom memory.

Westside moorage issues magnified. At the November Bamfield Harbour Authority AGM (attendance 16, last year 13) Chair Keith Wyton reminded us that the westside Fishermen's Wharf is, by contract, primarily responsible for commercial fisheries vessels. Presently, there are about 35 tie-ups used by locals, a few spaces for short time visitors and little for commercial boats. The government will pay major repairs but not for expansion of facilities, even if we put up the money.Rae Hopkins gave the financial report for 2021/2020: Income \$42K/\$32K, Expenses \$26K/\$currently in the bank \$164K. AGM elections resulted with the same directors continuing on. Zoom assisted by Zoom guru Jamie Willock. *L. Druehl*

A Gold Plated Bamfield Transportation Network Proposal was zoomed to 20 folks ("A" is assumed to be a person), presented by UBC architecture students. Involved were kayak/canoe launch/ storage pads, one at Nuthatch and the other at the old school dock area, and a trail through the westside marsh. Everyone appreciated their effort and most liked the proposal. Concern was expressed: would this project limit Community Hall access at Nuthatch?; would zig-zags in the trail obscure bears? Should there be lighting? Should structure design reflect Huu-ay-aht culture? Wouldn't the tides cover the westside staircase? and other. Jamie Willock summarized the proposal, noting the next steps would be to gain access rights and explore financing. L. Druehl
