Community Affairs AGM, May (30 zoomers) saw 4 directors stepping down and then standing for another term. Jaslyn Harbel, whose name had ben advanced "gracefully withdrew" avoiding an election and possible change in the status quo. Jamie Willock reviewed highlights of the Affair's Year: Initiating focus on our moorage problems and following up with a survey of public opinion (106 responses, results to follow). Affairs formed a local Bamfield Affordable Housing Working Group. The Bamfield Marine Sciences Centre has offered land. Affairs grants-in-aid: west Bamfield toilet upgrade (\$3,500), Wild Safe bear signage (\$1,232) and Wild Safety bear attraction reduction (\$5000).

Affairs General Meeting Bob Beckett (Bamfield's ACRD Director) noted 1. his suggestion ACRD recognize housing issues by seeking support to retain an advisor to explore initiatives to advance regional housing programs. 2. Acknowledged Clay Steell's ACRD presentation re. EV-chargers for Bamfield. Bob moved that ACRD explore grant opportunities for Bamfield and elsewhere. 3. Bob informed the ACRD staff that based on the Affairs Bamfield Moorage Survey, he would not support proposed bylaw changes. ACRD staff noted Affair's request that moorage bylaws be removed from our Zoning Bylaws. Sean Rogers (Director Bamfield Marine Sciences Centre) noted that the SD 70's survey of opinion re its strategic planning is closed but we may input at info@sd70.bc.ca. Sean has had his appointment extended for 5 years as fulltime Director. Sheryl Mass (Bamfield Parks) is seeking 12-15 folks in early July, for 3 days to construct new playground. The approach to the west side toilet has been repaired, courtesy of Community Forest and Affairs funds and the \$16.91 over-spendt by Bamfield Parks. Tom Jensen (Harbour Authority): Perennial Rae Hopkins is stepping down as secretary/treasurer. Discussions on increasing daytime use and longterm use are underway. Robin Schmitt (School) Students will attend a Port Alberni festival to perform a Huu-ay-aht song. (Your contributions to this paper will help pay for this trip!) Stefan Ochman (Road Safety): signage and a memorial for the deceased students at km 36 are being considered. Phil Lavoie (Fire Dept.): could provide backup within community for wildfire, 1 pumper truck on east side and 2 on west side. Ben West will light up cougar pass. The McInerneys impacted Bamield. John was the 1st & 3rd director. He initiated the award-winning Public Ed. Program and several major constructions. Bev nursed locally and at outposts up the coast. Both were active in the community and were responsible for prolonging our church's life. On one occasion, while they slept, a bear entered the unlatched door, helped itself to particular cake decorations, clawed some leather cushions and left...all undetected. A historical Note: John unknowingly was instrumental in establishing the first Bamfield Marine Station. He advised Aubrey Gorbman (one-time Chair of Zoology, UW, and President of the Zoological Society of America) of the rich slime eel population of Barkley Sound. Aubrey established his lab in the recently collapsed boathouse on Rance Island, that he named the Bamfield Marine Station. He gracefully surrendered that name when the 5 universities came to town. L. DANGEROUS WEATHER

What a contrast between the April and May weather in Bamfield. So wet in April; more than twice the average rainfall. We had 15.75 inches (400mm) of rain in April. Normal is 7.23 inches (184mm). That is more than any April rain total since I have been keeping records (2006) and the rainiest month since January of 2022. Then May-only 1.5mm of rain this entire month-so dry. Somebody turned off the faucet. The average rain for May is 4.19 inches (107mm). Temperatures have been pretty unremarkable with a short 3day warming where it got to a high of 31 degrees in May. Then Mary Scholey, a biker, minister, a purveyor of candy to kids and a contributor to the west side cat issue. In my recollection, Mary was the last employee to lick stamps.
