Some deficiencies that need attention to accommodate their needs: Downtown parking, Alcohol-free beer & wine & spirits, EV-charging stations, Information Centre, garbage cans, public benches, a statue of Eddie Banfield lying on its side, Old Farts in front of The Market & Mercantile. Cotton candy & Tee shirt concessions, a laundromat, Bumper stickers reading "Please Visit Tofino." Handicap accessibility, Directional signage, an oyster bar, Day hike trail map, and Downtown parking.

<u>Lest we forget</u>. They say now we can get to Port quicker, but the old road was posted at 70km and the new at 60km. And missing the potholes and bumps and washouts, visit Bamfield's Tower Road for a nostalgic drive.

13 attend Bamfield Road Committee AGM. Highlights of Chair Stefan Ochman's report: Bamfield Main chipped and sealed, and given a 1-year warranty; 9 tsunami signs purchased; 1 road and 3 trail counters and associated software purchased; a line will be painted on the road from Bamfield to Anacla in 2024; and the Road Reconciliation Committee will consider a memorial cairn at km 38. All previous directors were returned.

integral part of the Bamfield fishing fleet, the *Native III* sunk at the wharf in Port Alberni. Designed by **Jackson Jack** and built in Dodger's Cove in 1947 by Jackson and his son, **Ernie**. The double ender always seemed to ride easily through the water. **Johnny Vanden** said all of Jackson's boats seemed to go faster

with less power than other boats. "He went by eye and the shear was always perfect." Ernie and later, his son, **Alan**, would gas-up and buy fishing gear at Ostrom's. There was always time for Ernie and **Leonard Jennings** plus other guys in the store to enjoy each other's fishing tales. Ernie's sense of humour would set the whole store crowd laughing.
